Inspired by the herb project to find a rosemary-flavored chicken dish, Nancy Miskell found a dandy one on the internet. Fig and Rosemary Glazed Skillet Chicken is delicious & elegant yet easy to prepare. With only 15 minutes of prep time (mainly for destemming and chopping the rosemary & mincing the garlic & preparing the fig with balsamic glaze sauce) and 25 minutes of oven cooking time, using a cast iron skillet, this recipe is a keeper. It can easily be adapted for stove-top cooking. The complete recipe has been posted on the Activities board in the clubhouse entry. Merci, Nancy, and Bon Appetit!
